We would like to present world literature to our own people, but at the same time, also present ourselves to world literature. This is why we invited several exciting foreign authors to Hungary again.

Let's meet in the autumn, and, mark your calendars, next spring at the foot of the Elizabeth Bridge!

6 PM - 7:30 PM CONVERSATION: DOINA RUȘTI WITH KINGA ERŐS

Doina Ruști is a Romanian author, winner of several prestigious literary awards. Her works have been translated into many languages (English, German, Spanish, Italian, Greek, Macedonian, Hungarian). Her novel, *The Ghost in the Mill* was first published in 2008 by Polirom in Bucharest, and was honoured as the best novel by the Romanian Writer's Union Prose Award. It has since been reprinted in 2018 and 2024. The autobiographical novel can also be read as a parable of communism, where silence, coercion and its acceptance and complicity are part of everyday life. This is the first time the novel is available in Hungarian, so this event is also a book launch for Orpheusz, the publisher.

The translator, Enikő Szenkovics will also take part in the conversation.

Other contributors: Dávid Szenkovics cellist, while actor Bálint Turi will read excerpts from the novel.

6 PM - 7 PM CONVERSATION: J. D. BARKER WITH MÁRTON BENEDEK

J. D. Barker is one of the most important figures in contemporary thriller and crime fiction, also dabbling in other genres, like science fiction and horror. He frequently collaborates with other writers, and his trademark is mixing rational thought and supernatural elements. His novels revolve around solving the central crime, but in the meantime, we get to know the inner workings of both the victim and the criminal, and although his writing is often said to be cinematic, one of the most exciting games to play while reading his works is the way we imagine for ourselves his strange characters.

The main venue of the PesText Festival will once again be one of the most important cultural venues of Budapest: the Három Holló. This café and cultural centre opened its doors in 2017, on the 140th birthday of Endre Ady, and is named after a tavern that stood near the Opera House where the poet wrote many of his works and drank many a good wine. During the Festival, attendees may buy books from the webshop Jó könyvek, and also ask for an autograph from their favourite authors following the discussions.

26 SEPTEMBER 2024

5 PM - 6 PM CONVERSATION: VINCENZO LATRONICO WITH KRISZTIÁN PUSKÁR

This is what we see on the surface: various objects of Anne and Tom, arranged in perfectly designed quasi-disorder among the trendy furniture of their Berlin apartment, rented for an astronomical price: designer clothes, laptops and other essentials of the web designer's digital lifestyle, lush plants that present well on Instagram. In *Perfection* by Vincenzo Latronico, we are afforded a glimpse into the ever more popular 'expat' lifestyle through the lens of an Italian couple living in Berlin.

On the surface: a love story, but with more scrutiny, we find that this book leans towards a socially conscious mixture of a literary diary and documentary fiction, posing both generational and global questions, and inviting us to debate its themes.

Vincenzo Latronico will be joined by Krisztián Puskár, journalist, editor, cultural organizer and DJ.

6 PM - 7 PM CONVERSATION: BENJAMIN CHAUD AND ANNA T. SZABÓ

Benjamin Chaud is a French illustrator and author of children's books, well-known all over the world, and in Hungary he is mostly recognized for his illustrations.

Are you afraid of the dark? The dark is more afraid of you!, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to School... and This is why I didn't finish my homework..., all published by Pagony, showcased his penchant for funny and heart-warming pictures. His drawings are the cherry on top of Call Paris!, published by Open Books, featuring playful and humorous little poems translated by Anna T. Szabó.

7 PM - 8 PM CONVERSATION: SAMANTHA SHANNON WITH CSILLA KLEINHEINCZ

Samantha Shannon is a New York Times and Sunday Times bestselling author, born in London i 1991. She writes dystopian fiction and fantasy. Her first and still most famous series, the sever part The Bone Season debuted in 2013. Her novel, The Priory of the Orange Tree was published Next20 Publisher in 2024. Its prequel, A Day of Fallen Night will be published in November 2024 21. Század Publisher, so the attendees will have a chance to discover interesting titbits about new novel before it reaches general audiences.

8:30 PM - 10 PM ZINE PRESENTATION + ZSÜJA

Zsanett Liszkai, or as she is known in artistic circles, ZSÜJA, has been an active participant i Budapest electronic scene since the spring of 2019, and is also a sound engineer and a ma student of electronic composition at the Liszt Academy of Music. Her music is often called ambient noise, but she doesn't want to be bound by genre conventions. Her past releases published by EXILES. 6 PM - 7 PM CONVERSATION: GUNNAR GARFORS WITH PÉTER SZŰCS

Gunnar Garfors is a Norwegian media professional, author and world traveller. In this last profession, he achieved several world records: for example, in September 2014, he and his friends managed to visit 19 countries in just 24 hours. Now, with *Where Only Birds Fly*, published by Cser Pubisher, he invites us along for the ride, to follow him to the least visited countries on Earth: Guinea, Mauritania, Libya, Turkmenistan, Afghanistan, Kiribati, Nauru, Sao Tome and Principe as well as South Yemen. What does everyday life look like in the remotest parts of the world? How do people manage in crazy dictatorships or in societies where central power is absent? **Gunnar Garfors will be joined by Péter Szűcs, author, founder of the blog PetersPlanet.travel.**

5 PM - 6 PM CONVERSATION: PHILIPPE BRENOT WITH ZOLTÁN JENEY

It is almost a cliché now that comic books are not only for children, but this event may come as a surprise for the Hungarian audience, as it will be a real treat for adults – strictly for those above 18! In his comic book, *The Story of Sex: A Graphic History Through the Ages*, Philippe Brenot offers humorous suggestions on how to talk about sexuality without taboos, while also touching on important moments from the history of sex, both in France and around the world. Sexuality is as old as humanity itself, and let's face it: you would like to know what kind of erotic scenes were recorded by scribes in ancient Babylonia, right? What is the connection between Hammurapi and the word 'amour', how did our ancestors get it on in the Middle Ages, how did we finally reach sexual liberation in the 20th century? Philippe Brenot will be joined by Zoltán Jeney, author and translator. The event is open to people over 18 years old.



7 PM - 8 PM CONVERSATION: PER PETTERSON WITH ÁDÁM VAJNA

The prose of Per Petterson is characterized by its shockingly honest depictions of divorce, family trauma and social loneliness. The often seemingly aimless movements of his recurring characters (like Arvid Jansen) force us to rethink truths which we thought self-evident. His restrained narrative voice has a meditative effect, focusing on memory and associations, sharing just as much as it feels absolutely necessary. In Petterson's works, we are afforded a view of both personal destinies and the everyday workings of Norwegian society, with every novel exploring new depths. The award-winning author has a new book coming out in September, *Ashes in MyMouth, Sandin MyShoes.* **Per Petterson will be joined by Ádám Vajna, poet and translator.**

8:30 PM - 10 PM VILLŐ

Dóra Villő Czeizer is a Budapest-based singer-songwriter. Launched in 2021, her project 'Villő' is a collection of intimate and sensitive songs with an indie aesthetic. Her first song, Stolen Cups was published in the same year, with Márton Fenyvesi on mixing and mastering duties. Villő started performing in 2022, first in ruin pubs, at exhibition openings, and then in well-known venues of the Budapest scene, such as Aurora and Ellátó.

She plays the cello, classical and jazz guitar and has taken a course in Music Editing at the Sonic School. At the age of seventeen, she won a competition organized by the Ludwig Museum and the Petofi Literary Museum in the 'Music' category with the first version of Stolen Cups, which she recorded on a cassette in her room.

28 SEPTEMBER 2024

5 PM - 6 PM CONVERSATION: YRSA SIGURÐARDÓTIR WITH ESZTER T. MOLNÁR

One of the special guests at this year's PesText Festival will be Yrsa Sigurðardóttir: she not only won the Icelandic Crime Fiction Prize in 2011, but also works as a civil engineer and writes children's books as well. When it comes to the topic of suspense, Scandinavian crime fiction is perhaps one of the strongest buzzwords of the last decade. *Last Rituals* by Icelandic author Yrsa Sigurðardóttir has been translated to more than 30 languages. Her crime and thriller series and her horror novels are impossible to put down, thanks to their gripping plot and character-driven style. Whether you are reading the Thora series or the volumes following the investigations of Freyja and Huldar, or even the slower-paced *The Prey*, all her novels help us visit mystical Icelandic landscapes, practically dripping with cold and mysterious atmosphere. **Yrsa Sigurðardóttir will be joined by Eszter T. Molnár, author.**

6 PM - 7 PM CONVERSATION: FIONA MCPHILLIPS WITH RÓBERT SMID

Internationally renowned author Fiona McPhillips is visiting Budapest for the Hungarian launch of her bestselling first novel, *When We Were Silent*. The theme of this poignant thriller is the sexual abuse of minors, and has already garnered wide-ranging attention from the public. The style of McPhillips is reminiscent of the neo-noir highs of Dennis Lehane, and it is not a coincidence that the novel was recommended by the legendary Stephen King.

We recommend this extraordinary work to everyone, this very promising début attempts no less than reinvigorating the thriller genre.

Fiona McPhillips will be joined by Róbert Smid, literary historian and critic.

7 PM – 8 PM SERGEJ TIMOFEJEV WITH ANNA TERÉK

Sergej Timofejev is a poet and media artist from Latvia who writes in Russian. He has published his volumes of poetry in Latvia, Italy, Russia, Estonia, Georgia, Romania, North Macedonia. In the post-Soviet world, he was one of the first artists to engage in video poetry. He is an active member of the Riga-based Orbita poet's and artist's group, which aims to foster dialogue between different creative genres and media, encompassing text, music, videography, photography, instal-



lations and the Internet. As a regular participant in international poetry festivals, his works have translated into English, German, Italian, Swedish, Ukrainian and other languages. Replica is ird poetry book, originally published in Latvia, issued in Hungary by Prae Publisher.
